




## *Internship*

- Scientific internship: Under the supervision of Prof. Klaus Holzmann, scientists at the Department of Histology, Cytology, and Embryology have acquired proficiency in the quantitative diagnosis of changes in telomere areas within intracellular and extracellular environments. The outcomes of ongoing research will enhance understanding regarding the influence of stress on telomere length alterations and DNA damage.
- Students' summer practice: on the basis of an open competitive selection, 4 students of medical faculties were nominated and registered for summer practice.




# Search for novel drugs for the treatment of myeloproliferative neoplasms



**High-throughput screening (HTS assay) cell lines**





## hematoxylin derivative

Scientists from the research groups of Robert Kralovics and Roman Lesuk have recently identified hematoxylin as a novel inhibitor of the calreticulin gene (CALR).

Hematoxylin compounds target a specific domain of CALR, selectively eliminating CALR mutant cells, which have been identified as the causative agents of myeloproliferative neoplasm in patients. These findings offer valuable insights into potential treatment strategies for myeloproliferative neoplasms.



- The beginning of the cooperation - 1992, when Anatolii Shvydenko was invited to IIASA as a researcher by Academician of the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences by Professor Stan Nilsson
- many internships of Ukrainian scientists were held at IIASA, 6 research projects were completed, more than 50 joint scientific papers were published, including 2 monographs and 20 articles in scientific journals indexed in the Scopus database. In cooperation with IIASA, a number of international conferences, seminars, workshops, and forums have been held. An important element of cooperation is the invitation of scientists from IIASA to give guest lectures to master students majoring in forestry.
- The joint IIASA NUBIP-IUFRO Forum "Forest Science and Education in Ukraine: priorities for action" was held on November 21-22, 2023, Laxenburg. The event was jointly organized by IIASA, the National University of Life and Environmental Sciences of Ukraine (NULES) and the International Union of Forest Research Organizations (IUFRO).



# Ukrainian Partner Universities of the University of Klagenfurt (AAU)



## Specific Examples of Cooperation

- **Bilateral exchange agreements** (“Joint Study”) with all partners, some of which dating back to 1995
- Joint **Erasmus+ KA 107/171 mobility projects** with CHNU, KSU, NTU “KhPI” and KKNU since 2015
- 1992 – 2017 **jointly organized summer school** on language and culture for Austrian and Ukrainian students with NTU “KhPI”
- **Double Degree programme** “Software Engineering”/ “Informatics” with NTU “KhPI” since October 2017
- planned **Double Degree programme** “Computer Science”/ “Informatics” with KKNU

# Ukrainian students and staff at AAU since 24 February 2022

- **69 (sixty-nine)** incoming student mobilities and **5 (five)** incoming student mobilities for traineeship from partner universities in Kharkiv, Kherson and Chernivtsi
- **10 (ten)** incoming staff mobilities for teaching and/or training from Ukraine (partly long-term mobilities)
- Per semester ~ **20 (twenty)** non-degree seeking students from Ukraine participate in the MORE programme at AAU
